
## **SCHSSCA High School Senior Showcase**


# SCHSL State Championships



## SCHSL Handbook Revision - Soccer

The committee recommended changing the current rule allowing teams to play multiple games in a day at tournaments with a minimum rest of one hour in between to allowing this to be done for regular season and tournaments. The intent of this rule change is to give flexibility to schools that share space and have trouble rescheduling games in the spring time. This is only to be done in games at the same level. Therefore, it is not the intent of this change to allow an athlete to play a JV game and then a varsity game.



# SCHSL Handbook – All Sports

- Recommended Changes Overlapping All Sports
- 1. Scrimmage/Jamboree Rule
- Schools were allowed to have 4 scrimmages at the varsity level in previous years. This was reduced to 2 scrimmages and 1 jamboree last year.
- The recommendation from the committee is to allow varsity and sub varsity teams the ability to trade out a jamboree for an extra scrimmage. The rationale for this change is because a majority of sports have found it difficult to have a jamboree event, under the current rules, that allows for adequate competition or a financial benefit to the program. This change is back to a former rule that was in place in the handbook, although at a lower number of scrimmage/jamboree opportunities than before. This would be the first time this rule is given as an opportunity to sub varsity programs.
- There has been no opposition to this change other than some who would prefer to go back to 4 scrimmages.



#### Open Season

- The open season period would be recommended to change and follow the following schedule:
- There was a lot of discussion about the open season period. The consensus of the committee was that the current system has some limitations and we would like to give coaches more opportunities throughout the calendar with their athletes. However, there was a belief that the system used a few years ago when only the first 4 weeks of each season were closed and the rest of the calendar was basically open was too much open season for schools to manage. So the above system is an attempt to meet in the middle of the system.
- Some of the thoughts considered:
- a. The overlap of in-season athletics with open season periods is something that each school can monitor on a local level. The periods of time provided do not have to be used by the school.
- b. There was a lot of debate about bringing back the former rules that allowed coaches to work with a certain number of athletes each day. Ultimately it was determined that using a set number in a group per day has a history in our state of violations of these rules by member schools. The member schools have had much more success avoiding violations when windows of time to work with all of your athletes have been given.
- c. The most consistent criticism of the current system is that spring sports do not truly have a chance to get in their full amount of days. Between Christmas Break, school exams, and poor weather that timea of year, it was clear that spring sport coaches wanted opportunities to work with their athletes during periods of better weather in the fall.
- d. The basketball coaches association had requested opportunities to work with athletes in April because of the new NCAA recruiting periods. This was able to be met within the proposed system.
- While the committee understands that the open season rules typically bring a lot of opinions, we feel as if this system should be supported by the member schools because it touches on many of the concerns that schools have had with the current open season system.

#### 1. Preseason Invitational/Tournament/Showcases

- In the current system, schools are allowed one preseason tournament within a 10 day window of the beginning of the regular season. The committee proposes that schools be allowed to use that 10 day window to play invitationals, tournaments, or showcase events if they choose to, including any combination of these events if time allows. For example, a basketball team may choose to play a tournament over the weekend prior to Thanksgiving and then play in a two day showcase event the Tuesday and Wednesday before Thanksgiving Day. All games played would count toward the total number of games allowed to be played per sport.
- The rationale behind this change is that the each sport is struggling to play their maximum number of games per sport in the current regular season. This change would be twofold. First, it would allow teams the option to potentially play more events during the preseason period and alleviate pressure on their regular season schedule. Second, there are a limited number of tournaments available in the preseason, so the opportunity to play showcases and invitationals that are not bound by the restriction to crown a champion in a championship game will give more flexibility to schools looking to play in the preseason.

#### 1. Allowable Starters Rule

The allowable starters rule would replace the current 75% rule that governs the out of season competition rules. With the growth of sports outside of the traditional high school setting, there is more opportunity than before for athletes to compete. This change would make the numbers easier for coaches to understand and remember the mandated numbers, as well as giving some more opportunities to returning varsity athletes to play on outside teams coached by members of their high school or feeder school sport coaching staffs.



#### 1. Health and Safety Protocols

The current health and safety protocols section of the rules and regulations is a half-page document with only six points of information. The committee created a much more detailed document with some of the best practices that many member schools already have in place. We will present that to the executive committee to consider as a replacement to the current wording. It was suggested to our committee that this information is already on various sites used by certified athletic trainers and may be best to continue to come from those sources as opposed to in our rules and regulations section of the handbook.
